ΠΕΡΙΛΗΨΗ

Σκοπός της παρούσας διπλωματικής εργασίας είναι να εντοπιστούν και να αναλυθούν οι εννοιολογικές μεταφορές στη λογοτεχνία και ειδικότερα στην παιδική λογοτεχνία σε σχέση με την αναπηρία. Αρχικά, γίνεται μια ιστορική αναδρομή, προκειμένου να οριστεί η αναπηρία και τα είδη της, ενώ ερευνάται η απεικόνισή της στα έργα της λογοτεχνίας αλλά και της παιδικής λογοτεχνίας. Ακολούθως, αποσαφηνίζεται ο όρος «μεταφορά» και «εννοιολογική μεταφορά», καθώς και η κατανόηση αλλά και η ερμηνεία του μεταφορικού λόγου στους ενήλικες και στα παιδιά, ενώ ερευνάται και η σχέση της μεταφορικής γλώσσας στη λογοτεχνία. Ερευνάται ακόμη, η απεικόνιση της αναπηρίας στη λογοτεχνία μέσω της μεταφοράς, όπως και οι αρνητικές ή θετικές εικόνες που αυτή δημιουργεί στους αναγνώστες για τα άτομα με αναπηρία. Καταλήγουμε στην έρευνα, κατά την οποία, εντοπίζονται, αναλύονται και ερμηνεύονται μεταφορές στη λογοτεχνία και ειδικότερα σε παιδικά λογοτεχνικά έργα.
